

HOW TO SEW A SHIRT BUTTON

1. Thread needle with 18 to 24 inches of thread matching the other shirt buttons.
2. Knot ends of thread together.
3. Remove old thread from area of missing button.
4. Push needle from back of fabric to front, pulling all the way through to knot.
5. Thread the button onto the needle, and slide it all the way to the shirt. Make sure button is facing up!
6. Push the needle back through the other button hole and through the shirt fabric. Pull thread snug, but not too tight.
7. Continue sewing the button with six or seven passes of thread per hole. For a two-hole button, alternate back and forth. For a four-hole button, thread should form an 'X' pattern. Finish on the back side of the fabric.
8. Tie a knot close to the fabric. Trim excess.
